PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

Nirmal Haloi College was established on July 30, 1979, through the untiring efforts of a group of visionary individuals from the locality surrounding Patacharkuchi. Initially named Pragjyoti College, it began its journey in the premises provided by Pracchya Sangha, the oldest sports and socio-cultural organization of Patacharkuchi. This gesture made the vision of higher education in the area a reality. The college was later shifted to its present location on March 19, 1988.

The college started its academic activities by admitting the first batch of 52 students (28 boys and 24 girls) into the Pre-University (PU, now Higher Secondary) course. The founder Principal was Late Krishna Kanta Goswami, an eminent teacher of History at Bajali College. In its formative stage, the college had no permanent faculty members. However, a few dedicated teachers from Patacharkuchi Vidyapith Higher Secondary School came forward to teach without any remuneration.

The Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) course was introduced in 1985, with 32 students (20 boys and 12 girls). The college received permanent affiliation for B.A. Part-I from Gauhati University in 1987, and for B.A. Part-II in 1989. It came under the Grants-in-Aid system on January 11, 1996. The college was first assessed by NAAC in 2005 and was accredited with a C++. That same year, the college came under the Assam College Provincialisation Act.

In November 2007, the college was recognized under sections 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act. NAAC reassessed the institution during its second cycle of accreditation in 2016 and awarded it a Grade "B". The B.Com course was introduced as a self-financing programme in 2017 with Major subjects. The college is now affiliated to Bhattadev University from the academic session 2024–25. In the third cycle of NAAC accreditation in 2024, the college was awarded a Grade "B".

At present, approximately one thousand five hundred students are pursuing undergraduate education at the college.

Since its inception, Nirmal Haloi College has steadily progressed in both academic and infrastructural spheres. Today, it offers a range of undergraduate programmes and is committed to providing quality higher education to the students of the region. With a mission to nurture intellectual growth and promote holistic development, the college continues to play a vital role in shaping the future of Assam.

COURSES OF STUDY

REGULAR COURSES

A) Two Year Higher Secondary (HS) Course in Arts.

Eligibility : HSLC Examination passed or equivalent Examination.

No. of Seats available: = 150

- i) English is compulsory.
- ii) A Modern Indian Language (MIL) or Alternative English. Modern Indian Languages taught in the college is only Assamese.
- iii) A student must select three/four elective subjects from the following list :
 1. Economics, 2. Political Science, 3. Logic & Philosophy, 4. History,
 5. Education, 6. Sanskrit/Elective Assamese, 7. Mathematics.

Admission is given purely on merit and is subject to the Assam State School Education Board (ASSEB). All candidates shall have to apply through Darpan Portal for admission.

NOTE: A student shall have the option to exit the programme at three stages: after one year, two years, or three years. Upon exiting after the first year, the student will be awarded a Certificate. Exiting after two years will lead to the award of a Diploma. Those who exit after three years will receive a Bachelor's Degree. Students who complete the full four-year programme will be awarded a Bachelor's Degree (Honours).

Admission PROCEDURE

1. Admission process for Undergraduate Program will be conducted as per the timeline given by the Directorate of Higher Education Assam.
 2. For admission into the Four Year Undergraduate Program (FYUGP) offered at Nirmal Haloi College under Bhattadev University, all candidates must apply through Samarth eGov Suite only. No other route shall be considered.

 3. Candidates will be admitted purely on merit basis. Based on the marks secured in 10+2 or equivalent examination the merit lists will be prepared and made available on the college website as well as Samarth Portal.
 4. Candidates shall have to provide the photocopies of the following documents and shall produce original documents for verification at the time of admission.
 - a) Application form for admission (Generated from Samarth Portal)
 - b) Mark sheet of the last qualifying examinations
 - c) Pass Certificate.
 - d) Valid age proof document.
 - e) Caste Certificate. (If applicable)
 - f) Gap Certificate. (If applicable)
 - g) An Income Certificate from the Local Revenue Circle Officer or Ration Card issued by the competent authority for free admission under Fee Waiver Scheme of the Govt. of Assam
- ★ **A candidate whose parental income is below Rs.4 Lakh per annum is eligible for free admission.**

Academic Departments

■ Department of Assamese

The sole mission of establishing Nirmal Haloi College (earlier Pragjyoti College) is to provide education for the poor and disadvantaged with accessibility to higher education by bringing the education to the doorstep. Keeping the mission in sight the Department of Assamese was established in 1979. At that time, the subject of Assamese was introduced only for Pre-University classes due to the lack of accommodation for degree courses. Degree course in Assamese was introduced in 1985. But due to lack of building infrastructure, the undergraduate degree course in Assamese major was introduced in the year 1989. In the major course, the total number of students enrolled was 20. At present, more than 250 students are studying Assamese as Major subject in the UG program.

Department of Economics

Established in 1979, the Department of Economics is one of the oldest departments of Nirmal Haloi College. The department started functioning with only one teacher named Mr. Suresh Sharma. Subsequently Sri Bhabesh Das and Sri Jagadish Kalita Late Mahan ch. Kalita etc. joined the department. Initially classes under the department of economics were held in the Prachya Sangha. Later on, the department was shifted to the present college campus and subsequently shifted to the east part of the college campus in 2003.

In the beginning of this department there was an enrollment of less than 50 students in the H.S. classes (Previously Pre-University). The intake capacity had to be raised up to 225 in response to growing demand for undergraduate education in economics in the college. However the enrollment in economics has pegged back due to the induction of mathematical application in economics. At present the department has an intake capacity of 50 students in FYUGP. In view of the growing demand for postgraduate learning in economics the college provides the option for pursuing MA in economics under the distance education programme of GUCDOE (Previously IDOL-GU) and KKHSOU

Department of Education

Nirmal Haloi College erstwhile 'Pragjyoti College' was established in 1979 to meet the growing need of an institution for higher education at Patacharkuchi. At the time of the establishment of the college, the Education subject was first introduced in Pre-University Classes. There were only 52 students in the first batch of the college and the Education Subject was opted by 42 students only then.

The Degree course in Education (General) was introduced in 1985 with an enrollment of 09 students only. The major course in Education could not be introduced at that time due to the lack of qualified teachers and accommodation. The major course was introduced in 1993 by admitting 25 students.

Department of English

The Department of English, NH College, Patacharkuchi, has been playing the role of a forerunner in enlightening the poor and disadvantaged and the knowledge enthusiasts in the greater Bajali Sub-Division for the last four decades and a half. The Department right from its inception in July, 1979 has been endeavoring to fulfill the needs of the students in particular and the general public facing the challenges. The Degree course in English got affiliation with Gauhati University in 1987. Major course in English was introduced in 2003.

Initially, installed at the Pracchya Sangha, Patacharkuchi, the classes were managed by some prominent persons, retired teachers and educationists. Late Krishna Kanta Goswami, Head Department of History, Bajali College, Pathsala and also the Principal of Nirmal Haloi College for a period of two years, volunteered to take up English classes with tremendous success. Late Tralokya Goswami, a reputed person in the field of English teaching, came forward to help vitalize this institution with his untiring zeal and innovative teaching. Another learned and devoted member of the teaching family Sri Bhabit Ch. Haloi, Subject Teacher at Patacharkuchi Vidyapith, rendered his invaluable service selflessly contributing to the growth of this institution. Late Jogeswar Goswami, National Award winning teacher and retired Principal of Patacharkuchi Vidyapith, Late Maheswar Devnath, Subject Teacher in English, Patacharkuchi Vidyapith, Mrs. Manju Choudhury of Nityananda taught English at the college with great pains.

Students coming from poor and disadvantaged families and having previous poor academic records were enthused to do better and go ahead. Some of them had left their mark on the sands of life.

Department of History

The sole mission to establish Nirmal Haloi College (earlier Pragjyoti College) is to provide education for the poor and disadvantaged with accessibility to higher education by bringing the education to the doorstep. Keeping the mission in front, the Department of History was established at the time of its inception in 1979. The founder of the institution realized the importance of the subject as the famous historians realized- what men have done and said, and above all, what they have taught. The establishment of the Department has been done, but the problem of getting qualified teachers is the major problem. Hence, they appointed two qualified teachers from the nearby Higher Secondary School. There was a very good response from the students. The changing pattern of the course at the pre-degree and higher secondary school solved this. Secondary courses bring a set back to the subject, not only in this institution but also within the state as a whole. History has been made an optional subject at secondary schools. The UG course has also paid less attention to the subject. The list of founder teachers and details of the students' enrollment in the beginning are appended below. Presently, the department of History is functioning as a full-fledged department offering the following programme of studies.

The Nirmal Haloi College, erstwhile known as Pragiyoti College, was established in 1979 to meet the growing need of an institution for higher education at Patacharkuchi, since there was no proper accommodation or facility to open a degree course at the time of the establishment of the college. So, Logic subject was first introduced in pre-university classes. There were only 52 students in the first batch of the college, and the Logic subject began with only 15 students.

The Degree class (General Course) in Philosophy was introduced in 1989 with 4 students. The major course in Philosophy could not be introduced at that time due to the lack of a qualified teacher and building accommodation. The major course was introduced in 2000 with 9 students.

General Rules for Maintaining Discipline for Students

- Students are expected to maintain the highest standards of discipline and dignified manner of behaviour inside as well as outside the College campus. They shall abide by the rules and regulations of the college and should act in a way that highlights the discipline and esteem of the college.
- Students are expected to show respect to the teachers and non-teaching staff of the college both inside and outside the campus. Any act of indiscipline or misbehaviour by any student will attract punishment.
- Students should strictly adhere to the dress code of the college. It is compulsory for students to come in college uniform only and carry the 'Identity Card'. Casual dressing will not be permitted. They shall have to produce their IDs card to the college authority when asked for.
- Students should be regular and punctual in attending the classes and all other activities of the College. Minimum 75% attendance in classes is mandatory for students to appear in examinations (73% for female students)
- Absence without prior permission will adversely affect the evaluation of the student concerned. Bicycles and Two wheelers must be parked safely in the allocated places only. Vehicles found parked in unauthorized places shall be impounded.
- Ragging in any form - Physical, Mental or verbal is strictly prohibited. Disciplinary action will be initiated if any student is found involved in indulging into eve teasing, molestation, ragging, harassment, bullying and untoward incidents
- Strict silence should be observed inside the class room. No student should leave the classroom without permission of the teacher.
- Be polite and respectful to all others at the College and in the wider community. Student should not enter the office room, staff room or computer lab and others' class rooms without permission.
- Smoking, Chewing of Tobacco in any form (pan masala, gutka etc.) and alcoholic consumption is strictly prohibited within the college campus.
- It is the responsibility of the students to maintain the campus neat and clean. Spitting, smoking and littering the College campus must be avoided. Students are not supposed to draw and write anything on classroom wall: toilets, chairs, tables, desks etc.
- Students are advised not bring costly items like ornaments, watches, cell phones etc. to the campus. Students are responsible for the safe custody of their belongings. The college authority in no way shall be responsible for the loss of those items or cash.
- Students are expected to use social media carefully and responsibly. They shall neither post derogatory comments about other individuals of the College on the social media, nor shall indulge in any such related activities having grave ramifications on the reputation of the College and its authorities.

- No Meeting/Function/Procession of any kind shall be organized in the college premises without the written permission of the Principal.
- Maintain harmony among students belonging to different socio-economic status, community, caste, religion, region or ideology. Any act of discrimination (physical or verbal) based on an individual's gender, colour, caste, race religious beliefs, region, language, sexual orientation, marital or family status, physical or mental disability, gender identity etc. must be avoided.
- Students should complaint any type of sexual harassment immediately to the Internal Complaint Committee of college in writing. All complaint will be kept confidential and would be addressed in accordance with the guideline of Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibitions and Redressal) Act, 2013
- Students are expected to read notices put up on the College notice board. Ignorance of any notice thus displayed will not be accepted as an excuse for failing to comply with directions contained in it.
- Students shall avoid using any insulting, inciting, threatening language when talking with fellow students and should abstain themselves from violence.
- Students must not indulge in any illegal, unlawful or criminal activities, malpractices, misconducts, fraud, communal and immoral activities. In case he/she is found indulging in any of the above the college may take les action against him/her.
- Students must take proper care of all the college property. Any damage fully or partially to the property of the college by mistake or deliberately, the college shall have all the rights to recover the damages caused by him/her and impose fire on him/her or take any legal action against the student(s) involved.
- All students admitted to the College are subject to the discipline and control of the College authorities. The students are required to adhere strictly to the rules and regulations that may be framed from time to time by College authorities. In case of breach of discipline, the Principal shall have the power to fine, suspend or even expel the concerned student(s) from the College.
- The College reserves the right to delete, to add or amend the rules & regulations given above as and when deemed necessary.

Examination and Evaluation Procedure

The Principal of the college forms an Examination Committee comprising of three to four faculty members to oversee all examinations. Additionally, two to three non-teaching staff members assist the faculty.

Examination Rules :

The institution follows a set of rules for conducting examinations, which include :

1. **Internal Assessment:** Internal assessment is based on internal examination, home assignments, attendance, and extracurricular activities. The Internal Examination Committee conducts the internal examination periodically for both even and odd semesters at convenient dates. The Credits for each course are as per the examination rules of concerned university.
2. **University Examinations:** A separate external examination committee, comprising faculty and non-teaching staff, conducts university exams as scheduled by the parent university. The committee ensures adherence to university guidelines.

Evaluation Process :

The evaluation process consists of :

- **Internal Assessment:** Answer scripts and home assignments are evaluated by faculty members, and records of marks are maintained and sent to the parent university.
- **External Assessment:** Answer scripts of university examinations are sent to specified evaluation zones as per university guidelines.

Attendance and Examination Requirements :

- **Attendance:** Students are required to attend classes regularly, with a minimum attendance requirement of 75%.
- **Examination Attendance:** Students are expected to appear in all examinations conducted by the college during an academic year.

Support during Examinations :

- **Provision for sick students:** Arrangements are made for students who fall sick during examinations.

This examination system and evaluation process ensure that students are assessed fairly and consistently, and that the institution maintains high academic standards.

CENTRAL LIBRARY

The Central Library of N. H. College, named after Late Harendra Nath Sarma, a doyen in the sphere of education and Late Chakradhar Choudhury, a generous personality was founded in 1979.
